#### UNIFORM

- Smart watches
- Your child is allowed to wear a plain, gold / silver metal stud
  earring/pair of earrings: no stones, patterned designs or hoops.
  These must be removed by the child themselves before all PE lessons
  and placed safely in a clean envelope or bag provided from home. If
  your child is unable to independently or hygienically remove their
  earrings, then they must not attend school wearing them.
- All clothing and equipment must be clearly labelled with the pupil's name. The school will keep unnamed lost property for half a term and will offer parents the opportunity to check lost property upon request. After this period of time, the school will recycle/dispose items of lost property as appropriate.
- Make-up and nail varnish including temporary tattoos must not be worn
- Bags , pupils should bring a plain black, grey or Hunsley blue 'messenger' or 'backpack' style bag.
