

# Hunsley Primary Statement Regarding Sports Premium Spending and Pupil Engagement in School Sports

#### **Our Vision for Sport and Physical Education at Hunsley Primary**

The school believes that the opportunity to take part in sports and physical activities is the right of every child, regardless of age, gender, ability or interest. It is the school's obligation to ensure all children are offered regular, meaningful opportunities to participate in physical sports and that all children are encouraged to do so and their personal achievements celebrated, both as individuals and as a team.

The school's motto is 'We are a Team!' which is fitting in all areas of the curriculum, but especially team sports and physical activities, and we extend this team ethos to our peers at the secondary school by engaging as often as possible with whole school events at South Hunsley and working closely with the Sports Leaders to provide our pupils with engaging activities to take part in.

Such activities raise the levels of engagement in young children and consequently raise the sense of wellbeing and involvement, as well as, more broadly, their overall achievement.

The Sports and Physical Activity strand of the Hunsley Primary Improvement Plan has three priorities for development in 2016-17:

- To raise the level of participation in organised team activities for all children
  - Provision of workshop and coaching opportunities
  - o Provision of resources, equipment and storage facilities which are forward-looking for the growth of the school, but which also offer a wider range of sporting development than might otherwise be accessible in the temporary school building
  - To enable access to a range of engaging sporting spaces and resources throughout the year and to model the use of these to Hunsley Primary staff
- To enable the children to participate in inter-school sports activities
  - Development of effective partnerships
  - o Development of relationships with older role models through sport (e.g. the School Sports Leaders and Sports Captains)
  - o Provision of rewards and trophies for participation in such events
- To ensure that all staff delivering PE in the primary school, especially staff shared between both schools, are trained in delivering Key Stage 1 PE to achieve the best outcomes
  - o Subject specific training provided by external agencies
  - Visits to partner schools for observation and immersion

#### **Measuring the Impact of the Sports Premium**

Impact will be measured in the following ways:

- Progress of individual pupils in PE (Otrack / Classtrack)
- Progress of groups of pupils in PE, e.g. girls (Classtrack)
- Engagement of pupils in extra-curricular PE activities in school and beyond
- Progress of pupils in PSHE Health and Wellbeing (Classtrack)
- Progress of pupils against the Hunsley Primary Characteristics of Learning across the year (Classtrack)
- Feedback from staff members regarding the effectiveness of CPD (M&E: Staff CPD feedback forms)
- Judgements of Teaching, Learning and Assessment in PE lessons (M&E: lesson observations and zoning)
- Feedback from Sports Leaders, parents and pupils (M&E)

### How we will make the impact of the Sports Premium sustainable and how will the children benefit from the funding
