YEAR 1 and 2

Recorder Ensemble

We run our recorder ensemble on a Thursday lunchtime – this is led by Mrs Hudson. Please can children make sure that they always have their recorder with them in school, as we will occasionally adjust the club day where other curriculum activities may demand it, e.g. where school educational visits might clash.

The children should continue to practise their pieces and their finger positions each week at home. They each have a finger chart and pieces of music we are learning in the club.

If anyone new to recorder is interested in joining the club, then the practice is a key part of being involved – a real must-have, if the children are going to be ready each time we meet as an ensemble.

Being involved in a music club, such as our choir or recorder ensemble, or our new Music Service guitar ensemble, is such a good way to enjoy music socially and helps children with teamwork skills too.

YEAR 1

Year 1 Phonics Screening Preparation

As you know, your Year 1 child will be undertaking the Phonics Screening Check this summer term. The check is administered in school but it is a national test which all Year 1 children take, the results of which are reported to the DfE and Ofsted.

The children will be asked to read a set of decodable words in the Check, some of which are real and others 'pseudo' (nonsense words); this then checks each child's application of their phonic knowledge and whether they can blend with confidence and understanding. Each child will read the 40 words to a member of staff individually and we will record how they do. We will let you know how many words your child was able to read before the end of the summer term, once we are beyond the assessment window; all results and materials need to remain confidential until then.

We would welcome and encourage parental support in practising phonics application at home, to reinforce and embed what we are doing daily in school. We will communicate any additional individual support needed directly with you as appropriate.

Please follow these simple guidelines, to help your child reach their full reading potential this year and beyond:



- Practise spellings every day, this helps your child practise reading and writing the phonic sounds they are currently learning.
- Use the attached sounds mat to create your own nonsense words (such as vop, shomp, clousp). Ask your child to help you read the words.
- Continue reading of a variety of books. Encourage your child to apply their phonics when decoding words and blending these sounds back together.
- Play word games with your child (Junior Scrabble, Boggle, word searches, crosswords and hangman).
- Play games online which reinforces phonemes (such as <u>www.phonicsplay.com</u> (focus on Phase 5 games)

Please don't use any previous tests to help your child practise as we use them to help the children prepare for the test and for our own internal assessments.

If you should have any questions about the Check or how best to support your child's developing reading skills, please ask at any time and we will be very happy to help.

As ever, thank you for continuing to work in close partnership with the team.
