Hunsley Primary Uniform

Thank you to the Hunsley Primary Parent Partners for doing a great job of sorting our 'pre-loved' uniform stock and helping us to have a more sustainable approach to reusing uniform. Hopefully, you have been able to order what you need. Please do see the details below about how the Parent Partners are managing this if you want to find out more, or indeed if you want to donate uniform.

As you prepare for September, we want to give you plenty of notice to ensure uniform purchased meets the policy. We have a really simple policy here for items with the Hunsley logo on them – everything else can be bought from the supermarket, to ensure you have a range of places to shop.

The details of the uniform are below, so that you are able to check what is needed. This extends to hair styles and hair decorations as well. It's important for parents and carers to be sure of the policy so that the children are dressed the same and we all have a consistent approach. A reminder about bags below too, which are covered by the policy and should be plain.

Light grey skirt or pinafore dress - 'A' line, plain, knee length, no splits. or	Should not be made from tight or stretchy fabric.
Light grey trousers - or	Formal, classic, smart trousers, waist height (not skin-tight and not jeans/denim/chino style.)
Light grey shorts	Summer months only - formal, classic, smart shorts of waist height and knee length
White polo shirt	Standard white polo shirt with plain edged collar; shirt must be long enough to be tucked in and wide enough at the neck to fasten the top button.
Cyan blue jumper Cyan blue cardigan	Parents may also choose to purchase a Hunsley Primary logo polo shirt, however this is an optional purchase. Round neck with school logo only. Must have school logo on.
Socks	Plain light grey. Socks must not be worn over tights. Ankle socks or knee socks permitted. No white or sports socks permitted, except for PE.
Tights	Plain (not patterned) light grey coloured. Leggings are not permitted.
Footwear	Plain, flat, black shoes (no sandals, slip-ons, ballet pumps, mules, sling-backs, long boots, Ugg boots, trainers or baseball shoes). Plain black leather/leather look ankle boots are permitted.
Indoor footwear – Reception only	Please note: Reception are no longer required to bring indoor shoes. They should adhere instead to the above 'Footwear' guidelines.
Wet weather footwear	If your child wears wellingtons for the journey to school, please make sure they also bring their black school shoes to change into. Wellingtons must also contain your child's name. Your child should bring a waterproof bag to store the wellingtons in.
Bags	In Reception and Key Stage 1, pupils should bring a plain black / dark grey book-bag (the school logo book-bag can be purchased from Rawcliffes/Steady Schoolwear although this is optional).

In Key Stage 2, pupils should bring a plain black, grey or Hunsley blue 'messenger' or 'backpack' style bag.

Pupils in Reception - Year 4 should not wear any jewellery.

Jewellery

If your child is in Year 5 or 6, they are allowed to wear a plain, gold / silver metal stud earring/pair of earrings: no stones, patterned designs or hoops. These must be removed by the child themselves before all PE lessons and placed safely in a clean envelope or bag provided from home. If your child is unable to independently or hygienically remove their earrings, then they must not attend school wearing them.

Pupils may wear a plain watch with a dark strap.

Smart technology accessories

Should not be worn. Any Smart wear, including Smart watches worn as pedometers, falls under our category of mobile phone technology, and are not to be worn to limit distraction and to safeguard all pupils when in school.

Make-up and Nail Varnish – including temporary tattoos

Should not be worn.

Hair

No extreme styles. No hair dye. Hair decorations are not permitted, except a simple black, grey or Hunsley Primary blue 'Alice' band. Longer hair should be tied back with a plain black, grey or Hunsley Primary blue hair 'bobble'. Hair grips should also be plain black, grey or Hunsley Primary blue. *Please note: small, simple ribbon or bow-type 'bobbles', bands and grips in the above colours are allowed.*

Please ensure that your child brings their PE bag containing clothing for both kinds of PE at the start of each week and we will encourage your child to take the bag home at the end of the PE lesson for washing.

PE bag

Plain, black or grey, drawstring bag large enough to contain the full kit (the school logo PE bag can be purchased from Rawcliffes / Steady School Wear although this is optional).

Indoor PE

Plain, white, round-necked cotton T-Shirt with short sleeves

Plain black PE shorts

White sports socks

Indoor school shoes (Reception Only) or trainers - see below.



Outdoor PE: (indoor PE kit doubles as outdoor kit with the addition of the listed items*)

Plain, white, round-necked cotton T-Shirt with short sleeves (see above)
Plain, black PE shorts (see above)
White sports socks (see above)
*Plus:
Plain, black or grey outdoor trainers (these should be sturdy trainer shoes suitable for outdoor games)
Plain, light grey tracksuit top (pull-on, with a round neck – no hoodies)
Plain, light grey tracksuit bottoms (for cold weather)



It is advisable to consider having more than one sweatshirt or cardigan, to make washing and drying more practical - play can be messy business! Children do wear aprons when engaging in painting and other messy play activities, but accidents can happen.

Pre-loved Uniform

We regularly have 'pre-loved' sales of uniform items which can prove handy when needing a second jumper or cardigan! If you have spare uniform which no longer fits your child, please let us know.

If you have placed an order with the Parent Partners for preloved uniform, please ensure that you send payment in an envelope with your child. Please write clearly on the envelope your child's name and the items that you are paying for. Please ask you child to give this envelope to their teacher.



Eligibility for Free School Meals & Pupil Premium

Reception and Key Stage 1 pupils are entitled to take up a daily free school meal as part of the Universal Infant Free School Meals national initiative, which has been in place since September 2014. In addition, Families who receive certain benefits may be eligible for free school meals, regardless of the child's age.

Registering for free meals could also raise an extra **£1,320** for your child's primary school, to fund valuable support like extra tuition, additional teaching staff or after school activities - so it is beneficial to the school to be aware of your child's eligibility even during Key Stage 1.

This additional money is known as the **'Pupil Premium Grant'** and is available from central government for every child whose parent is receiving one of the benefits listed above.

To find out if your child is eligible the benefits team at your Local Authority can process your claim by telephone or alternatively you can complete the online form at <https://www.gov.uk/apply-free-school-meals>. If your child is eligible you will receive a confirmation letter from your Local Authority within 10 days. Upon receipt of this letter please do notify the school.

Mealtimes and Snack times

We encourage parents to take up the provision of a school meal where possible, discuss menu options with their child and encourage them to enjoy the food we have on offer.

If your child does not wish to eat the school meal on a specific day, a packed lunch must be provided, which should not include fizzy drinks, sweets, chocolate bars or items containing nuts. We encourage parents providing a packed lunch to ensure a balance of food items is included.

We provide the children in EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2 with a healthy, fresh snack each morning, which will vary from fruit, such as apples or pears, to vegetables such as carrot sticks – we encourage your child to try and eat their snack each morning to give them energy for learning that day. EYFS children under 5 are also entitled to free milk as part of the Nursery Milk Scheme.

Children in Key Stage 2 are welcome to bring in a snack from home for morning play time. We ask that they bring something healthy – i.e. a piece of fruit or vegetable - as part of the school's promotion of healthy snacks.

Children should also bring their own water bottle. Please do not send your child with juice or cordial in their water bottle for drinking during the day – they should only bring water.

The surveys can be completed at home or school/college on a phone/tablet or laptop via links and the QR codes. Please encourage children and young people in your school to complete a survey, where possible providing an opportunity for them to do so during the school day. If you are able to do this, please ensure parents and carers are informed about the survey taking place, perhaps through your school newsletter and the links can also be provided should you consider it more appropriate for this to be completed at home. If you are a parent or carer yourself, please also ask your child or young person.

Many children and young people will be able to complete the survey independently, others may need additional support to read the questions. You will know best how to help children and young people to complete the survey as independently as possible, whilst taking into account any individual special educational needs or disabilities. The survey is anonymous and we will not be able to identify any individual data from those who complete it, therefore it will be important to emphasise with the children and young people where they can go for additional support if they are worried or concerned about anything.

It will be ideal to get as many children and young people's views from our local area represented as possible and the final date for completion is Friday 18th June 2021.
