This week, we have been focused on our visit from the English Hub, working with the team as we implement our new phonics scheme, **Little Wandle**. The feedback from children, teachers and families has been brilliant, and we were very impressed by the children's progress when our colleague from the English Hub came to visit. Well done, everyone! It is fantastic to see the children enjoying their reading and progressing so well.

You might recall we took part in the **Cut Your Carbon** challenge again last term. Well done, everyone. We are so proud of the children and families who took part and made a difference. Keep it up!

The **House Team Development Day** on Tuesday last week saw the children focus on charitable thinking and action. They worked in House Teams (Aquila, Volans and Lacerta) to research and plan a charitable or fundraising act they would like to take part in in **House Team Development Week, 13-17 July 2026**! On Friday, in assembly, we all shared the plans: cake sales, litter picks, toy donations, stalls, time spent supporting the community – we can't wait (especially for the cakes).

Year 6 and Reception took part in workshops last week on healthier living, including handwashing sessions and **Healthy Lifestyle** tips. Thank you to the Integrated School Nursing Team for delivering this to the children. If you have any questions about health or wellbeing in school, please get in touch. Pupil Health and Wellbeing

As we return from the Christmas break, we are aware that there are still some bugs doing the rounds in our school and wider community. Whilst there is always some useful information on our school website under **Parent Info | Pupil Health and Wellbeing** including our '[**Pupil Health and Wellbeing document**](#)' and the '[**ERYC and NHS Guidance for Parents on School Absence**](#)' we have also included below a link to further NHS information and guidance:

As a school we continue to follow these approaches:

- Modelling to the children how to effectively wash their hands
- Keeping rooms ventilated whilst still being aware, when temperatures drop outside, of children needing to be warm enough inside
- Daily cleaning of touch points - door handles, light switches, interactive whiteboards
- Additional measures for keeping clean, especially for those younger pupils.
- Plenty of tissues in the classroom and around the site for those who need to use them

Our unprescribed medicines procedure allows for children who just need that extra support of Calpol or other paracetamol-based medicine for up to 48 hours, to be supported to stay in school.

Our 48 hour sickness and diarrhoea policy means that children who do unfortunately become poorly only return to school 48 hours after their last bout of sickness and/or diarrhoea.

The school has a responsibility to report certain illnesses to Public Health and we therefore request that if you are reporting your child absent from school you ensure that you detail their symptoms so that our illness monitoring and reporting can be completed accordingly.

Parent / Carer Feedback in Action

You may recall that we consulted with families in Autumn about **Home Learning** so that we can explore how children can best be supported by school and parents to complete their homework.

One suggestion which was made by families was to combine more physical and online resources for completion. So, we are going to start to trial this, starting in Year 6. We have bought a range of CPG workbooks for the Year 6s to take home each week and complete activities which Mr Sloan will direct.

We have used these books before, and the feedback has often been really positive from parents and children. Mr Sloan will be in touch this week with further details.

To help with this activity, and all Home Learning across school, don't forget that we have some super free 'Home Learning Packs' (colourful bags of resources you might find handy to help your child get on with their learning) which can be picked up from the Main Office. If you would like one of these bags, please get in touch or call in to see Mrs Hitchin.

The Inclusion Group will also be exploring how Home Learning can remain inclusive for children and parents, for example by reducing the online aspects of the activities and helping to provide access to physical resources to support at home.

We are looking forward to the next group meeting – a warm welcome to parents and carers who have not been before and to regular members of the group. This is such an important group to us at Hunsley Primary, as it helps us to shape and to meet the aims of our Inclusion Plan. - Developing a map of local services and provision to help parents and carers to access the things they need for their families
- Reviewing school provision from an Inclusion perspective – we are looking at Home Learning as our current focus

It is therefore important that the form is submitted well in advance of the absence so that the school still has time to process the form following the resolution of any queries or missing information. As above all forms must be processed prior to the absence as we cannot process them or authorise an absence retrospectively.

We also remind families of our hope that you will work in partnership with us to reduce school absence for holidays, and other unauthorised activity, and increase consistent attendance. The Local Authority tracks unauthorised absences in tandem with the school, and we want to remind parents and carers that clusters of shorter holidays (e.g. long weekends) which accumulate to 10 sessions in 10 weeks over time are also a concern in terms of absence.

Ultimately, we would ask parents **not to take any holidays in term time** and to send your child to school regularly in **support of our attendance policy**. Thank you for helping the children to attend school and achieve their best outcomes.

It's important to us that we help families to have plenty of options for getting hold of uniform. 
Inclusion Group

Forest school 4 week programme run by Fitmums

The Forest Project offers bereavement support in a Forest setting for children from 6–17 years who have experienced the death of someone special to them (programmes are organised in appropriate age ranges). Children can get involved in activities such as den building, camp fire cooking, tool making, tree climbing, forest games and rope work etc. Grief support is built into these activities, aimed at helping children explore their grief and loss. Activities are varied and children have the chance to try many different things to help them as they process their bereavement and connect with others in similar situations. Trained Forest Leaders and Bereavement Support Facilitators lead

sessions – all of whom have current DBS checks and have done safeguarding training.

We recommend children attend the session on their own, we hold mobile numbers for emergency contacts whilst the children are in the Forest. There are no facilities for parents to stay and wait other than in their own cars. Staff meet children in the carpark at the farm and return them there at the end of the session. Lunch is provided on the long day session, and snacks on the half day sessions. Children should bring a labelled water bottle to every session and wear outdoor clothing. We have a range of second-hand warm clothing if required.

Toilet facilities are available. Children will get most out of this programme if they attend all 4 sessions. If the dates of this programme do not suit please ask us about future dates via heather@fitmums.org.uk.

Dear parents,

Places are now available to join a new 12-week football course every Friday at East Riding Leisure Haltemprice, which is open to both boys and girls.

Our courses teach children correct football techniques by FA qualified coaches who have full DBS (CRB) clearance to work with children. The structure for the course is 'FUN through Football,' building confidence for total beginners and moving onto more complex sessions for experienced players.

We provide a **ball per player** for the majority of our drills ensuring children get more touches of the ball and improve quicker than conventional coaching where children are waiting around to have a turn. The sessions are held on the fantastic 3G pitch so trainers should be worn. Players are also advised to bring a still drink for the session.

The club has links to local junior teams of which players will be able to play for at the weekend. Players who show advanced ability on the course will be recommended for trials at professional academies. Players who have previously attended courses are currently playing for Bradford City, Sheffield United, Sheffield Wednesday, Manchester United, Liverpool, Leeds United, Everton and Oldham.

The cost of the course is just £6.25 per week, which is payable in two instalments. The first payment of £25 is due when booking your child on and the second payment of £50 due at the first session. Parents are encouraged to watch the sessions but are welcome to leave children, as every session is fully supervised.

****NEW TOURNAMENT FORMAT****

Every four weeks we have a tournament in order for the children to put their new-found skills into practice with medals awarded at the end of the course for various categories.

ALL PLAYERS WILL RECEIVE A TROPHY AND MEDAL at the presentation, which is held on the final week of the course. Additional trophies will also be awarded in each group from categories including; Best Attitude, Star Player, Most Improved Player, Most Promising Player and Hardest Working Player.



