A warm welcome to the Newsletter to our new Reception Families and to the new families who have joined us this term! This is the first of many Newsletters you will receive during your child's journey at Hunsley Primary and we are all really happy that they are now part of the Hunsley family.



It is no wonder that Reception have had an exciting term, with giants, secret gardeners, aliens and cheeky caterpillars all dropping by to cause mild chaos! I wonder if Miss Clark ever got her lunch back?

This is always the busiest time in a school calendar – assessments, events, reports, visits, and a lot of change, moving up in year groups and – for some of our children – moving on to the next school. Well done, to the **Year 3/4 rounders team** for representing the school at South Hunsley last week. You were a super team. We are excited to be getting new team kits coming in soon; can't wait to see how smart they will look. Last week, Key Stage 2 enjoyed a presentation from the **UK Parliament Schools Team** – this was a fascinating talk and really encouraged the children to get involved and learn more about national democracy and Government. **Year 3 took part in a Water Cycle Workshop** for their geography and science learning and **Reception were also down on the farm at Acorn Hollow**, being creative with mud art! In other news, the Eco-Team members have been busy writing to the local MP, David Davis, about plastic pollution – all in a day's work for the children!

So, with the **hot days ongoing**, you'll have spotted my messages home about water bottles, sunscreen, PE kits and hats. Your Child's Transition to Hunsley Primary

To ensure a smooth transition to Hunsley Primary, a number of key events will take place between now and your child's first day at school in September. It was lovely to see so many of our new Reception children at our 'Welcome to the Hunsley Family' and our 'Stay and Play' events at the school and we look forward to seeing them again over the Summer Term.



- **Summer Fayre** – Our Summer Fayre will be taking place on **Saturday 4 July, 10am – 2.30pm**. This is an annual event we hold at the school that is supported by our [Hunsley Primary Parent Partners](#). Further details about this event will be sent out in due course.
- **Reception Induction Afternoon and Meet the Teacher event**
On **Tuesday 14 July** there will be two transition events taking place. Our **Reception intake induction afternoon for your child** to attend will take place at the school from **1.30pm – 3.00pm**. The East pedestrian gate will be opened at 1.25pm and you will be able to make your way around to the Reception classroom to drop off your child. At 2.55pm the gate will be reopened for you to collect your child.

Our **Reception 'Meet the Teacher' Event for parents** will take place in the Reception classroom from **4.00pm – 5.00pm**. The West Pedestrian gate will be open for you to access the school grounds and make your way around to the Reception classroom. **Please note that during this time our wraparound provision may be using the outdoor areas therefore the internal school gates may be closed. If you do open them to gain access to the back of the school, please do close them again after you.**
- **Preschool/Home Visits** – Our Reception team will carry out Preschool visits to see the children in their familiar settings. Once we know which Preschool your child attends, we will contact them to arrange these visits. If your child does not attend Preschool or **if you would like us to visit your child where they are most 'at home' we can also offer home visits and we would like to ask parents to let us know if you would welcome one of these visits, too.**

SAFEGUARDING AND WELLBEING FOCUS

Safeguarding in Education Team - Digital Scam

Please see below message that has been shared by the Safeguarding in Education Team.

Dear Parents and Carers,

We want to make you aware of a digital scam currently targeting students through messaging apps and social media. Students are receiving messages containing a link that claims to show a video of a school fight. Clicking this link does not show a video; instead, it triggers a malicious script or downloads intrusive adware onto the phone.

What Happens If Clicked?

Screen Turns Black and White: The phone immediately switches to grayscale mode. Settings Lock: It attempts to restrict access to certain settings menus to prevent removal.

Mooing Sounds: The phone intermittently plays a loud "mooing cow" noise or display-disrupting pop-up ads.

Action Steps for Parents

If your child's phone has been affected, please do not panic. The device is not permanently broken.

Follow these steps to restore the phone:

Restore Colour: Fix the black-and-white screen by turning off grayscale. On iPhone, navigate to Settings > Accessibility > Display & Text Size > Colour Filters. On Android, go to Settings > Accessibility > Colour and Motion > Colour Correction.

Remove Malicious Software: Restart the phone in Safe Mode so the malware cannot run. Go to Settings > Apps and completely uninstall any unfamiliar apps, especially those with blank names or missing icons.

Stop the Noises: The mooing sound usually triggers via browser notifications. Open the internet browser (like Chrome or Safari), go to Settings > Site Settings > Notifications, and block all unfamiliar websites.

Please speak with your children and remind them never to click on unsolicited links, especially those promoting school fights or sensational videos.

Free School Meal Eligibility changes

From the start of the 2026 to 2027 academic year, the DfE are expanding FSM eligibility to all children from households in receipt of Universal Credit regardless of household earnings. Free school meals are available to pupils in receipt of, or whose parents are in receipt of, one or more of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

A pupil is only eligible to receive a free school meal where both:

- a claim for this support has been made
- their eligibility has been verified by the school where they are enrolled or by the local authority

Households may also be entitled to a meal if they:

- are in receipt of income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- receive the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- meet criteria set out in separate guidance for [families with no recourse to public funds](#)

Important Information

All current FSM eligibility is to be re-assessed in line with the above criteria by the East Riding of Yorkshire Council. If the claim does not meet the criteria, the ability to claim a free school meal will expire at the end of the current academic year.

The Local Authority will inform families who are no longer eligible.

From 1st September 2026, only families that have the above listed benefits will be eligible.

Spotlight on Attendance

Hunsley Primary team-members are very pleased to work closely in partnership with parents to help ensure that every child has the opportunity to fulfil their potential. Regular attendance in school is vital for each child to engage fully in learning and achieve well.

The attendance of individual pupils and 'whole school' attendance is measured using a percentage score which we monitor weekly. A percentage of **95% or above** is the benchmark for good school attendance.

Sickness Absence

A copy of the East Riding and NHS guidance for parents on child absence due to medical appointments and illness can be found on our website. We are happy to advise further on school policy should you have any questions.

If your child has suffered from sickness and / or diarrhoea, the school policy is to follow the East Riding and NHS advice and ask that you keep your child at home for 48 hours from the last bout of sickness and / or diarrhoea. This is to prevent the spread of infection across the school.

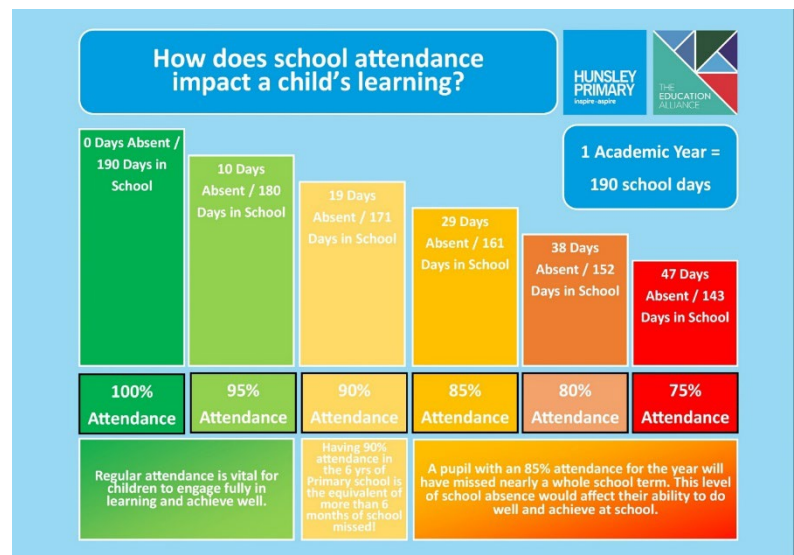
Understanding your child's school attendance rate

Once a child has missed 10 school days (2 weeks) during a school year. They will not be able to achieve a 95% school attendance rate for that year. Below is a table that you can use as a rough guide when considering the impact of your child's yearly school attendance rate.

Attendance Rate	95%	90%	85%
Equivalent number of school weeks missed	2 Weeks	4 Weeks	6 Weeks

As you can see from the table, a pupil with an 85% school attendance rate for the year will have missed nearly a whole school term. This level of school absence would affect their ability to do well and achieve at school.

With regard to the attendance of young pupils who may be more prone to tiredness, coughs and colds than their older peers, the priority of Hunsley Primary is to support and encourage parents to ensure that it is possible for their child to achieve 95%+ school attendance. Our high levels of care offered throughout the day should offer reassurance to parents who may have concerns about sending their child.

Bluebird Way – traffic, parking and safety

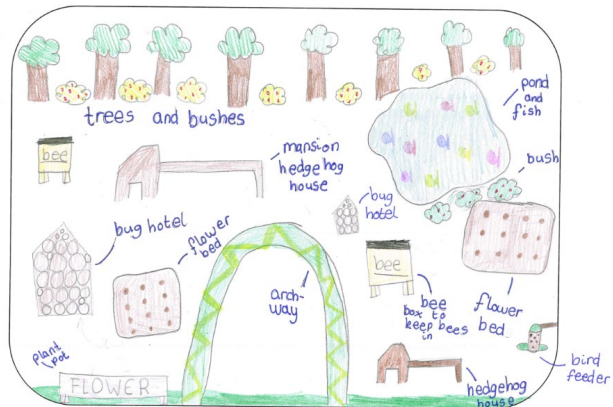
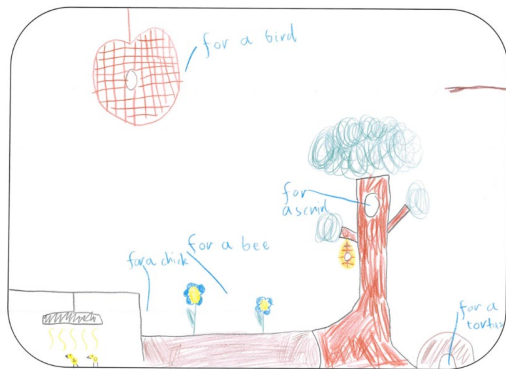
We have been in touch with Horncastle and the local contractors building along Bluebird Way to seek reassurances about delivery times, parking of large vehicles and general road safety.
