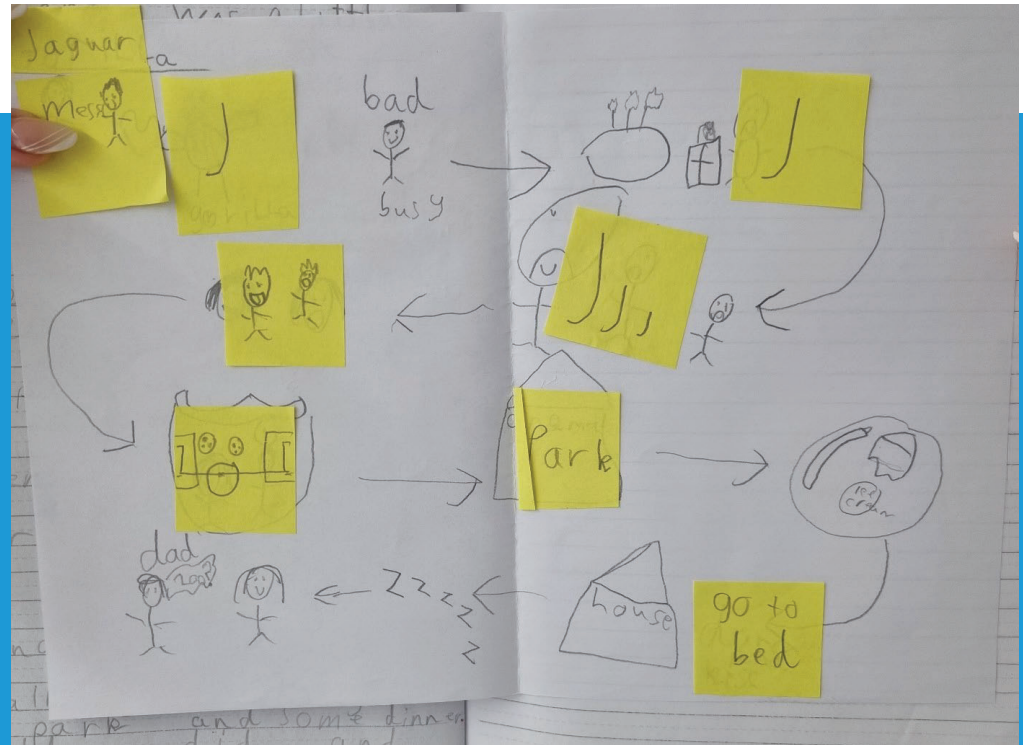

## SPELLING IN YEAR 2

- Focus switches within Phase 6 phonics to spelling.
- Application of Phase 3/4/5 phonics for spelling is key, particularly considering alternative graphemes for spelling.
- Different ways to practise spelling are taught.
- Learn spelling of Year 2 Common Exception Words.
- Intervention for any phonics gaps.
- Phonics screening will take place for those who need to take the assessment in June 2023.

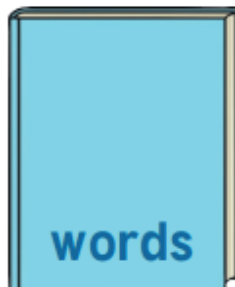




